DOCUMENT DESCRIPTION:

APPROVAL of a Human Resources Contract between the City of Topeka and Insight Public Safety and Forensic Consulting, LLC, for providing psychological services for pre-employment evaluations, critical incident counseling, fitness for duty testing, and other related psychological evaluation services.

(Approval will authorize the City Manager to sign and execute the contract that is estimated to exceed \$50,000 for services as indicated.)

VOTING REQUIREMENTS:

Action requires at least six (6) votes of the Governing Body.

POLICY ISSUE:

Whether to approve the contract for professional services. Pursuant to TMC 3.30.010, all contracts for professional services exceeding \$50,000 must be approved by the Governing Body.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Governing Body approve the contract as part of the consent agenda.

BACKGROUND:

Human Resources has approved this vendor as the approved health care provider for psychological examinations. Human Resources has confirmed that there are no other vendors with comparable services in the region, which is necessary and required for face to face evaluations. Additionally, the city has issued RFPs and this has been the only organization to respond. Human Resources has determined that the psychiatrist at Insight Public Safety is the only one in the region with the qualifications to evaluate potential staff for public safety work. City Legal sees this as appropriate to be handled as a sole source standardization process. The city does not have a psychiatrist on retainer and refers potential employees or those that have been through an event requiring the services.

BUDGETARY IMPACT:

Approximately \$60,000

Contract (Insight Public Safety Consulting and Forensics)

This agreement is entered into this ______ by and between the City of Topeka, Kansas, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as the City and **Insight Public Safety and Forensic Consulting LLC**, hereinafter referred to as the Consultant.

WITNESSETH:

Whereas, the City did accept the description of services and schedule of fees by the Consultant for providing psychological assessments for City of Topeka employees; and

Whereas, the Consultant desires to provide such services, as hereinafter agreed and to which is outlined and attached hereto as **ATTACHMENT A** and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

1. <u>PRICE</u>

The Consultant shall perform all work in accordance with the terms, conditions, and described services. **The agreed price under this Contract is shown on ATTACHMENT B and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein**. The City will pay the Consultant the contract price upon delivery, acceptance, presentation of invoice, and compliance with all procedures of the Department of Administrative and Financial Services.

2. TERM OF AGREEMENT

This agreement shall become effective upon the date indicted above and shall remain in effect through contract through **December 31, 2025**, or until canceled by either party with sixty (60) days written notice. This agreement may be renewed for four (4) additional one (1) year periods under the same terms and conditions, by written agreement of the parties.

3. <u>TIME OF ESSENCE</u>

It is agreed by and between the parties that time and punctuality are essential elements of this contract and that the parties will perform the obligations assumed by them as and when provided by the terms of the proposal.

4. AGREEMENT WITH KANSAS LAW

All contractual agreements shall be subject to, governed by, and construed according to the laws of the State of Kansas.

5. **INDEMNIFICATION**

Consultant hereby agrees to fully indemnify and hold harmless Owner and any of its departments, divisions, agencies, officers, employees and elected officials from all loss, damage, cost, or expenses specifically including attorneys' fees and other expenses of litigation incurred by or on behalf of the Owner and any of its officers, employees or elected officials arising out of Consultant's negligent performance of services under this Agreement. Consultant specifically agrees that this duty to indemnify and hold harmless will apply to the following:

- A. Claims, suits, or action of every kind and description when such suits or actions arise from the alleged negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Consultant, its employees, agents, or sub-consultants.
- B. Injury or damages received or sustained by any party because of the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Consultant, its employees, agents, or sub-consultants.

6. <u>TERMINATION DUE TO LACK OF FUNDING APPROPRIATION</u>

If, in the judgment of the City Manager, sufficient funds will not be available to continue the functions performed in this agreement and for the payment of the charges hereunder, the City may terminate this agreement at the end of its current fiscal year. City agrees to give written notice of termination to Consultant at least 30 days prior to the end of its current fiscal year. Consultant shall have the right, at the end of such fiscal year; to take possession of any equipment provided City under the contract. City will pay to the Consultant all regular contractual payments incurred through the end of such fiscal year, plus contractual charges incidental to the return of any such equipment. Upon termination of the agreement by City, title to any such equipment shall revert to Consultant at the end of City's current fiscal year. The termination of the contract pursuant to this paragraph shall not cause any penalty to be charged to the City or the Consultant.

7. <u>TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE</u>

The Director of Contracts and Procurement or designee may terminate performance of work under this contract in whole or in part whenever the Director determines that the termination is in the best interest of the City. In the event of termination, the Director or designee shall provide the Consultant written notice at least thirty (30) days prior to the termination date. The termination shall be effective as of the date specified in the notice. The Consultant shall continue to perform any part of the work that may not have been terminated by the notice.

8. <u>TERMINATION FOR CAUSE</u>

This Agreement may be terminated for cause by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice. Notice of termination for cause shall only occur after the breaching party has been notified of the breach in writing and has failed to cure such defect within thirty (30) days. The Consultant shall only be entitled to compensation to the extent of actual work performed. In the event Consultant terminates the Agreement prior to having earned all monies paid in the initial progress payment, the Consultant within thirty (30) days refund the balance of said progress payment to the City.

9. TERMINATION FOR PERFORMANCE

If Consultant materially defaults in the performance of any of its duties or obligations under this Agreement which default is not substantially cured within thirty (30) days after written notice is given to the Consultant specifying the default, or, with respect to those defaults which cannot reasonably be cured within thirty (30) days, if the Consultant fails to proceed within thirty (30) days to commence curing said default and to proceed with all due diligence substantially to cure the default, but in any event does not substantially cure the default within ninety (90) days, then the City may, by giving written notice of termination to the defaulting Consultant, terminate this Agreement as of a date specified in the notice of termination (the "Termination Date") such Termination Date being subsequent to the date of the notice of termination.

10. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

No provision of this contract will be given effect that attempts to require the City to defend, hold harmless, or indemnify any Consultant or third party for the City's acts or omissions. The City's liability is limited to the liability established in the Kansas Tort Claims Act, K.S.A. 75-6101 et seq.

11. DISCLOSURE; LITIGATION.

The Contractor agrees to disclose on an annual basis any litigation the Contractor is or was involved in in the previous year.

12. <u>NOTICES.</u> All notices, demands, requests, approvals, reports, instructions, consents or other communications (collectively "notices") which may be required or desired to be given by either party to the other shall be in writing and shall be made by personal delivery or sent by United States certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, or by overnight delivery, prepaid, addressed as follows or to any other persons or addresses as may be designated by notice from one party to the other:

- 13. <u>RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES</u>. It is understood by the parties that the Contractor is an independent contractor with respect to the City, and not an employee of the City.
- 14. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS.</u> This agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Kansas and the Codes of the City of Topeka, Kansas.
- 15. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>. Neither the City nor the Contractor shall assign any rights or duties under this agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Nothing contained herein shall prevent the Contractor from employing independent contractors, associates, or subcontractors; however, in such case, the Contractor shall be responsible for the performance of the services.
- 16. <u>INSURANCE.</u> The City shall not be required to purchase any insurance against loss or damage for any property or service to which this agreement relates. Subject to the Kansas Tort Claims Act (K.S.A. 75-6101 et seq.), and the claims provisions of the Code of the City of Topeka (Section 2-476 et seq.), the Consultant shall bear the risk of any loss or damage to any personal property in which the Consultant holds title. The Consultant shall maintain on file in the Contracts and Procurement Division at all times during the duration of the agreement, including renewal periods, a current and valid Certificate of Insurance that provides the following amounts:

17. ANTI-DISCRIMINATION CLAUSE

The Consultant agrees: (a) to comply with all federal, state, and local laws and ordinances prohibiting unlawful discrimination and to not unlawfully discriminate against any person because of age, color, disability, familial status, gender identity, genetic information, national origin or ancestry, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, veteran status, or any other classification protected by law in the admission or access to, or treatment, or employment in, its programs or activities; (b) to include in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, the phrase "equal opportunity employer;" and (c) to include those provisions in every subcontract or purchase order so that they are binding upon such sub-Consultant or vendor. The Consultant understands and agrees that the failure to comply with the requirements of this paragraph may constitute a breach of contract, and the contract may be cancelled, terminated, or suspended, in whole or in part, by the City of Topeka.

18. <u>ACCEPTANCE OF CONTRACT</u>

This contract shall not be considered accepted, approved or otherwise effective until the legally required approvals and certifications have been given.

19. ARBITRATION, DAMAGES, WARRANTIES

Notwithstanding any language to the contrary, no interpretation shall be allowed to find the City, or any department or division thereof, subject to binding arbitration. Further, the City of Topeka shall not be subject to attorney fees and no provision will be given effect, which attempts to exclude, modify, disclaim, or otherwise attempt to limit implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose.

20. <u>REPRESENTATIVE AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT</u>

By signing this contract, the representative of the Consultant thereby represents that such person is duly

authorized by the Consultant to execute this contract on behalf of the Consultant and that the Consultant agrees to be bound by the provisions thereof.

- 21. <u>RESPONSIBILITY FOR TAXES.</u> The City of Topeka shall not be responsible for, nor indemnify a Consultant for, any federal, state or local taxes, which may be imposed or levied upon the subject matter of this contract.
- 22. <u>CASH BASIS AND BUDGET LAWS.</u> All contracts are subject to the State of Kansas Cash Basis and Budget laws. [K.S.A. 10-1101; 79-2925 et seq.] Any obligation incurred as a result of the issuance of the contract or purchase order binds the City only to the extent that funds are available at the time payment is required.
- 23. <u>ENTIRE AGREEMENT.</u> The terms and conditions set forth herein constitute the final written expression of all the terms of this transaction and is a complete and exclusive statement of those terms. This agreement supersedes any prior or contemporaneous oral or written agreement, proposed agreements, negotiations, and discussions with respect to the subject matter hereof. Any representations, promises, warranties or statements by any employee or agent of the Contractor that differ in any way from the terms of this written agreement shall be given no force or effect.
- 24. <u>WAIVER OF CONTRACTUAL RIGHT</u>. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce and compel strict compliance with every provision of this agreement.
- 25. <u>TERMS HEREIN CONTROLLING PROVISIONS.</u> It is expressly agreed that the terms of each and every provision in this agreement shall prevail and control over the terms of any conflicting provision in any Attachment or Exhibit incorporated into this agreement.
- 26. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. If any provision of this agreement shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and enforceable. If a court of competent jurisdiction finds that any provision of this agreement is invalid or unenforceable, but that by limiting such provision it would become valid and enforceable, then such provision shall be deemed to be written, construed, and enforced as so limited.

27. EXECUTION IN COUNTERPARTS

This contract may be signed by fax or electronic signature, which will be deemed to be an original signature. This contract may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, and all of which shall be deemed to constitute one and the same instrument.

Explanation of Psychological Services

Wellness, Formal Management Referral, Fitness for Duty Evaluations, Independent Causation Evaluations, Safeguarding, and Promotional Readiness Evaluations

Wellness Check/Individual Critical Incident Stress Debrief

Purpose:

- courtesy to employee
- managing psychological impact of singular event or compounding events

Criteria for Initiation:

- involved in a critical incident in work setting or extreme personal situation
- cumulative stress related to work or duties related to work (i.e. Peer Support team member, dispatch understaffing, multiple bad calls or difficult situations back-toback)

Deliverables:

- Indication that they attended
- Indication that they participated
- Possible Request for follow up visit(s) and/or allowance to take sick or personal days (however very little, if any information will be given back to agency on why the request is being made) (typical reasons include; no sleep, high temporary stress response resulting in memory or attention issues)

Format of Deliverables:

- verbal or brief email
- or very brief letter on letterhead that says very little except what is mentioned above

Formal Management Referral

Purpose:

- problematic behaviors in work setting that likely have psychological component
- address problematic work behaviors and re-engage them positively back in to work setting
- occasionally part of progressive discipline

Criteria for Initiation:

 work-related behavior that needs improvement, suspected psychological reason for under-performance, either as expressed by employee, or noted and/or suspected by supervisor (latter initiation should consult with clinician to make sure)

Deliverables:

- Initial report on psychological factors contributing to work performance problems
- Recommendations on what will be required to attempt to adequately fix the problem
- Follow up sessions (variable number), working only on work performance improvement, each session documented and notes go to employer

Format of Deliverables:

• Email or fax

Fitness for Duty Evaluation

Purpose:

- Determine safety of employee in work setting
- Determine mental capability of performing duties required

Criteria for Initiation:

- Demonstrated psychological status likely to impair or already has impaired work reliability, stability, engagement
- See IACP and Case Law article (2016)
- See IACP standards for Fitness For Duty

Deliverables:

- Formal report stating final determination of "Fit" or "Not Fit"
- Recommendations for remediation, should that be requested by agency

Format of Deliverables:

• Formal report, emailed or faxed

Independent Causation Evaluation (usually for Work Comp determination)

Purpose:

- Determine factors related to psychiatric illness
- Determine causation so pay source can be established

Criteria for Initiation:

• Request for Worker's Compensation coverage for mental illness

Deliverables:

• Formal report

• estimation of adequate level of intervention (i.e. inpatient, outpatient, psychiatry, neurology)

Format of Deliverables:

• Formal document with header, emailed or faxed

Safeguarding

Purpose:

- Prevention of cumulative stress/trauma effects associated with an occupation
- Early identification and treatment of major psychiatric issues
- Extend the duration of individuals' capacity to stay in highly skilled positions
- Meant to be done yearly, preferably with same provider, to track changes over time and help individual make choices about continuing in unit/high-risk position, or not
- NOT intended to assess capacity to stay in their current role. No determination about work status or role made

Criteria for Initiation:

- High stress or high-risk position such as special victims, sex crimes, homicide, cyber-crimes (such as child porn), taskforce work, and strongly recommend for undercover positions
- Usually mandated by a department policy as simply a requirement of being in a specialized unit or position

Deliverables:

- Attendance reported back to employer
- If there is a request for further psychological services or follow up (only at employee consent)

Format of Deliverables:

- verbal or brief email that they attended
- or very brief letter on letterhead that says very little except what is mentioned above only

Promotional Readiness Assessments

Purpose:

- Included as part of a promotional process/intended to supplement an agencyinitiated promotional process to determine whom may possess better skills for the environment in which they will be working with and leading others.
- Provide insight into the individual's overall supervisory or leadership style

- Includes explanation of individual strengths and weaknesses as it pertains to leadership and supervisory skills
- Identifies potential pitfalls or challenges likely if selecting an individual for promotion
- Intended to also act as data for screening out individuals with toxic or harmful leadership traits that could negatively impact those they supervise or the quality of the work environment or agency in general

Criteria for Initiation:

• Part of a promotional process initiated by the agency

Components:

- Psychological Testing to assess for personality traits that correspond to leadership styles and supervisory behaviors
- Behavioral Interview

Deliverables:

- Full written evaluation with ranking or categorical determination*
- Post-process coaching (1-hour) back with the initial evaluator after ranking has been set or promotional decisions have been made- we encourage a voluntary process on this post-promotional process offering. (we discourage the agency from forcing candidates to come back for feedback/should be on voluntary basis)

*Agency can determine if they would like candidates ranked against each other (i.e. first, second, third) or if they would prefer a letter grade (categorical) assigned to each candidate (the letter grade has a specific categorical explanation for each letter assignment)

Scope of Services:

 Psychological assessment and documentation of post-conditional offer new hire candidates for certified law enforcement officer positions and other similar or related positions within public safety agencies including but not limited to; civilian jailers and detention center employees, firefighters, paramedics, and dispatchers.

Suggested Process:

- Schedule Post-Offer New Hire Psychological Evaluation with provider through the office administrator at 913-652-6668 or via email listed above. Email scheduling is preferred in order to have documentation of the contact/appointment and applicant information.
- Send Pre-employment Background Investigation Report and Polygraph Results Report to the office, prior to candidate presenting for evaluation (if available)
- Candidate presents for evaluation, completes computerized and paper assessments, and results are immediately complied prior to interview with psychologist.
- Psychologist interviews candidate (has background, polygraph, and testing data all complied pre-interview in order to guide questioning)
- "Verbal" delivered to agency contact immediately at completion of evaluation interview if candidate is clearly going to pass. If questions persist, agency will also be notified and "verbal" will be delivered as soon as other necessary materials are collected to make a final decision.
- Report created and delivered to listed point of contact within agency.

Relevant Guidelines for Post-Conditional Offer Assessment:

IACP- at least two scientifically validated personality tests, in person psychological interview conducted by a doctorate level psychologist (PhD/PsyD) or equally qualified mental health practitioner such as a psychiatrist (MD/DO)

CPOST- licensed psychologist, or medical doctor who has completed a residency in psychiatry. Have at least five years of clinical diagnostic experience. At least two written scientifically validated psychological tests used to examine abnormal behavior, a clinical interview.

Psychological Test Selection Background Information:

Assessment selection is based on compliance with the above IACP and CPOST guidelines (at least two scientifically validated psychological tests, one of which needs to assess abnormal psychological behaviors and thought processes)

The CPOST meta-analysis research findings also strongly advocate for assessment of the following personality and behavioral elements:

- Integrity/Ethics
- Emotion Regulation/Stress Tolerance
- Assertiveness/Persuasiveness
- Social Competence
- Decision Making/Judgment
- Impulse Control/Attention to Safety
- Conscientiousness/Dependability
- ✤ Adaptability/Flexibility
- Teamwork
- Avoidance of Substance Use and Other Risk-Taking Behaviors

Cost of Services:

\$550 per New Hire Evaluation, includes the two or three standardized and validated psychological tests (number dependent on position applying for) and written assessment of professional judgment and decision-making, as well as written and verbal communication skills.

Please Note:

New Hire Psychological Reports include any information regarding past psychiatric history, even if untreated. This includes information about periods of depression, anxiety, or other psychological disorders that may have not been addressed in any formal setting, but likely met criteria. This includes any relevant information regarding:

- pre-existing PTSD diagnosis or treatment,
- alcohol and drug treatment,
- inpatient psychiatric care,
- outpatient psychological or psychiatric services,
- other counseling services, and
- prior history of use of psychotropic medications.

This evaluator will request records from any prior treatment provider if deemed relevant to the position the candidate is being evaluated for. The intention of this is twofold; firstly to make an assessment on psychological fitness for the job, but also to formally document any pre-existing conditions before entering employment so it can be used as a reference in any future workers' compensation claims or service usages.

STANDARD AGREEMENT FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, is between the City of Topeka, Kansas (Owner) and Professional Engineering Consultants (Engineer);

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Owner wishes to employ the Engineer to perform professional engineering services on 701049.00 Topeka Boulevard – 15^{th} Street to 21^{st} Street. These services include engineering design and construction documents for the construction of a five-lane arterial street, six/eight-foot share use path, sidewalk, and drainage improvements (the Project); and,

WHEREAS, the Owner requires certain engineering services in connection with the Project (the Services);

and,

WHEREAS, the Engineer is prepared to provide the Services;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises contained in this Agreement, the Owner and Engineer.

agree to the following:

ARTICLE 1 - EFFECTIVE DATE

The effective date of this Agreement shall be _____

ARTICLE 2 - GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Kansas and the codes of the City of Topeka

ARTICLE 3 - SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY ENGINEER

Engineer shall perform the Services described in Attachment A, Scope of Services, in accordance with applicable sections of the City of Topeka Design Criteria and Drafting Standards of latest revision.

ARTICLE 4 - COMPENSATION

Owner shall pay Engineer in accordance with the Attachment B, Compensation.

ARTICLE 5 – OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

Owner shall be responsible for all matters described in Attachment C, Owner's Responsibilities.

ARTICLE 6 - SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENTS

The provisions set forth in Attachment D, Supplemental Agreements shall be incorporated into this Agreement.

ARTICLE 7 - PROJECT SCHEDULE

The provisions set forth in the Attachment E, Project Schedule shall be incorporated into this Agreement.

ARTICLE 8 - STANDARD OF CARE

Engineer shall exercise the same degree of care, skill, and diligence in the performance of Services as is ordinarily possessed and exercised by a professional engineer under similar circumstances.

ARTICLE 9 - INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

Engineer hereby agrees to fully indemnify and hold harmless Owner and any of its departments, divisions, agencies, officers, employees and elected officials from all loss, damage, cost, or expenses specifically including attorneys' fees and other expenses of litigation incurred by or on behalf of the Owner and any of its officers, employees or elected officials arising out of Engineer's negligent performance of Services under this Agreement. Engineer specifically agrees that this duty to indemnify and hold harmless will apply to the following:

a. Claims, suits, or action of every kind and description when such suits or actions arise from the alleged negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Engineer, its employees, agents, or subcontractors.

b. Injury or damages received or sustained by any party because of the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the Engineer, its employees, agents, or subcontractors.

Engineer shall purchase and maintain during the life of this Agreement, insurance coverage which will satisfactorily insure him against claims and liabilities which arise because of the execution of this Agreement. The insurance coverages are as follows:

- Commercial General Liability Insurance, with a limit of \$1,000,000 for each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the general aggregate.
- (2) Automobile Liability Insurance, with a limit of \$1,000,000 for each accident, combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage.
- (3) Worker's Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance, in accordance with statutory requirements, with a limit of \$500,000 for each accident.
- (4) Professional Liability Insurance, with a limit of \$1,000,000 for each claim and aggregate.

Prior to issuance of the Notice to Proceed by Owner, Engineer shall have on file with Owner certificates of insurance acceptable to Owner. Said certificates of insurance shall be filed with Owner in January of each year or may be submitted with each agreement.

Engineer shall also maintain valuable papers insurance to assure the restoration of any plans, drawings, field notes or other similar data relating to the work covered by this agreement, in the event of their loss or destruction, until such time as the work has been delivered to the Owner.

Upon completion of all Services, obligations, and duties provided for in this Agreement, or if this Agreement is terminated for any reason, the terms and conditions of this Article shall survive.

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ARTICLE 10 - LIMITATIONS OF RESPONSIBILITY

Engineer shall not be responsible for: (1) construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, procedures, or safety precautions and programs in connection with the Project, (2) the failure of any contractor, subcontractor, vendor, or other Project participant, not under contract to Engineer, to fulfill contractual responsibilities to the Owner or to comply with federal, state or local laws, regulations, and codes; or (3) procuring permits, certificates, and licenses required for any construction unless such responsibilities are specifically assigned to Engineer in Attachment A, Scope of Services.

ARTICLE 11 - OPINIONS OF COST AND SCHEDULE

Since Engineer has no control over the cost of labor, materials, or equipment furnished by others, or over the resources provided by others to meet Project construction schedules, Engineer's opinion of probable construction costs and of construction schedules shall be made on the basis of experience and qualifications as a professional engineer. Engineer does not guarantee that proposals, bids, or actual Project construction costs will not vary from Engineer's projected schedules.

ARTICLE 12 - REUSE OF DOCUMENTS

All documents, including, but not limited to, drawings, specifications, and computer software prepared by Engineer pursuant to the Agreement are instruments of service in respect to the Project. They are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by Owner or others on extensions of the Project or on any other project. Any reuse without prior written verification or adaptation by Engineer for the specific purpose intended will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Engineer. Any verification or adaptation requested by Owner shall entitle Engineer to compensation at rates to be agreed upon by Owner and Engineer.

ARTICLE 13 - OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Except as otherwise provided herein, engineering documents, drawings, and specifications prepared by Engineer as part of the Services shall become the sole property of Owner, however, that both Owner and Engineer shall have the unrestricted right to their use. Engineer shall retain its rights in its standard drawing details, specifications, data bases, computer software, and other proprietary property protected under the copyright laws of the United States. Rights to intellectual property developed, utilized, or modified in the performance of services shall remain the property of Engineer. Owner shall have the unlimited right to the use of intellectual property developed, utilized, or modified in the performance of the Services at no additional cost to the Owner.

ARTICLE 14 - TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. The nonperforming party shall have fifteen calendar days from the date of the termination notice to cure or to submit a plan for cure acceptable to the other party. Owner may terminate or suspend performance of this Agreement for Owner's convenience upon written notice to Engineer. Engineer shall terminate or suspend performance of the Services on a schedule acceptable to Owner. If termination or suspension is for Owner's convenience, Owner shall pay Engineer for all Services performed prior to the date of the termination notice. Upon restart, an adjustment acceptable to Owner and Engineer shall be made to Engineer's compensation.

ARTICLE 15 - DELAY IN PERFORMANCE

Neither Owner nor Engineer shall be considered in default of the Agreement for delays in performance caused by circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the nonconforming party. For purposes of this Agreement, such circumstances include abnormal weather conditions; floods; earthquakes; fire; epidemics; war, riots, or other civil disturbances; sabotage, judicial restraint, and inability to procure permits, licenses, or authorizations from any local, state, or federal agency for any of the supplies, materials, accesses, or services required to be provided by either Owner or Engineer under this Agreement.

Should such circumstances occur, the nonconforming party shall, within a reasonable time of being prevented from performing, give written notice to the other party describing the circumstances preventing continued performance and the efforts being made to resume performance of the Agreement.

For delays in performance by Engineer, as set forth in Attachment E, Project Schedule, which are caused by circumstances which are within its control, such delays shall be documented on the Engineer's Project Performance Evaluation form. Said form shall be completed at the conclusion of Project and acknowledged by both Owner and Engineer. Completed form shall be retained by Owner for a period of five years and reviewed prior to consultant selection for City projects.

In the event Engineer is delayed in the performance of Services because of delays caused by Owner, Engineer shall have no claim against Owner for damages or contract adjustment other than an extension of time.

ARTICLE 16 - COMMUNICATIONS

Any communication required by this Agreement shall be made in writing to the address specified below:

Nothing contained in the Article shall be construed to restrict the transmission of routine communications

between representatives of Engineer and Owner.

ARTICLE 17 - WAIVER

A waiver by either Owner or Engineer of any breach of this Agreement shall be in writing. Such a waiver shall not affect the waiving party's rights with respect to any other or further breach.

ARTICLE 18 - SEVERABILITY

The invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement or the occurrence of any event rendering any portion or provision of this Agreement void shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other portion or provision of this Agreement. Any void provision shall be deemed severed from this Agreement, and the balance of this Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if this Agreement did not contain the particular portion or provision held to be void. The parties further agree to amend this Agreement to replace any stricken provision with a valid provision that comes as close as possible to the intent of the stricken provision. The provisions of this Agreement this entire Agreement from being void should a provision which is of the essence of this Agreement be determined void.

ARTICLE 19 - INTEGRATION

This Agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between Owner and Engineer. All prior and contemporaneous communications, representations, and agreements by Engineer, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Agreement, as set forth in Attachment D, Supplemental Agreements are hereby incorporated into and shall become a part of this Agreement

ARTICLE 20 - SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

Owner and Engineer each binds itself and its directors, officers, partners, successors, executors, administrators, assigns, and legal representatives to the other party of this Agreement and to the directors, officers, partners, successors, executors, administrators, assigns, and legal representatives of such other party in respect to all provisions of this Agreement.

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ARTICLE 21 - ASSIGNMENT

Neither Owner nor Engineer shall assign any rights or duties under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Unless otherwise stated in the written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any obligation under this Agreement. Nothing contained in this Article shall prevent Engineer from employing independent consultants, associates, and subcontractors to assist in the performance of the Services; however, other agreements to the contrary notwithstanding, in the event Engineer employs independent consultants, associates, and subcontractors to assist in performance of the Services, Engineer shall be solely responsible for the negligent performance of the independent consultants, associates, and subcontractors so employed.

ARTICLE 22 - THIRD PARTY RIGHTS

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than Owner and Engineer.

ARTICLE 23 – RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to hold or to make the Owner a partner, joint venturer, or associate of Engineer, nor shall either party be deemed the agent of the other, it being expressly understood and agreed that the relationship between the parties hereto is and shall at all times remain contractual as provided by the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

BASIC SERVICES

The project is specifically defined below:

The PROJECT provides for the reconstruction of SW Topeka Boulevard, from SW 15th Street to SW 21st Street. The reconstruction improvements will include construction of a five-lane arterial street with curb and gutter, storm sewer, six/eight-foot wide shared-use path, sidewalk, grading, and erosion control. Side roads and entrances will be reconstructed only as required to accommodate horizontal and vertical alignment modifications.

The Engineer agrees to provide the following services.

- 1. Basic Engineering Services:
 - a. Provide project correspondence and consultation with Owner.
 - b. Attend and assist in facilitating a pre-design kickoff meeting with Owner to formalize the design criteria and project boundaries, lines of communication and overall project procedures.
 - c. Provide project deliverables consisting of the following sealed by an Engineer licensed in the State of Kansas where applicable.
 - i. Concept Plans
 - ii. Field Check Plans
 - iii. Right-of-Way Plans
 - iv. Office Check Plans
 - v. Final Check Plans
 - vi. Bid Documents (including special provisions if necessary)
 - d. Provide an engineer's opinion of probable cost at concept, field check, office check, final check and bid document submittals.
 - e. Facilitate design review meeting with the Owner at each submittal stages as listed above.
 - f. Provide record drawings to the Owner based on the red-line marked-up plans within 30 calendar days after red-lined marked-up pans are provided to the Engineer by the Owner.
- 2. Field Survey Services
 - a. Set inter-visible control points in area of construction. Obtain reference ties.
 - b. Set benchmarks within area of construction.
 - c. Recover sufficient monumentation as required to enable drafting of boundary information.
 - d. Procure Ownership and Encumbrance Report(s) for subject parcel(s).
 - e. Collect topographic survey data, including surface locations sufficient to provide 1' contours per the survey limits.
 - f. Locate all above and below grade utility improvements. PEC will not be responsible for searching for utilities beyond utilizing the One Call system.

- g. Compare record information received from utility providers to actual utilities flagged in the field. Notify locating service of any discrepancies and make a reasonable effort to resolve in the field. Utilities identified in record information that cannot be resolved in the field will be drafted in the general alignment shown in the record information and will be specifically identified as "RECORD" on the deliverable drawing. PEC is not responsible for the accuracy of utility information not physically identified on-site.
- h. Locate all sanitary and storm sewer structures, such as area inlets, curb inlets, junction boxes, manholes, etc., the top of structure information will be collected as well as all flowlines in and out, and pipe size/material.
- i. Locate all buildings and substantial features, including parking stripes, sidewalks, paving limits/type, playground areas/equipment, landscape areas, etc.
- j. Tree limits, groups of trees and specimen trees will be identified and shown in the drawing. Any trees four (4) caliper inches and larger shall be identified/shown
- k. Survey limits that extend into the adjacent street right of way shall include all improvements/utilities within the half width of right of way.

I. Purpose for Request

The City of Topeka (City) is requesting proposals for professional engineering services for Project No. T-701049.00, "SW Topeka Boulevard (SW 21st Street to SW 15th Street)" (the Project). The services include providing engineering design and construction documents for the complete reconstruction of the roadway.

II. Background Information

SW Topeka Boulevard is a five-lane arterial roadway that serves as a major north-south route through the heart of the City. The corridor from SW 21st Street to SW 15th Street consists primarily of commercial and business development. The Stormont Vail Events Center, a major regional multi-event venue, is located on the west side of SW Topeka Boulevard between SW 21st Street and SW 17th Street with the main entrance on SW Topeka Boulevard across from SW 19th Street.

The project is anticipated to begin north of the SW 21st Street intersection at the northern terminus of the SW 21st Street & SW Topeka Boulevard intersection reconstruction project (scheduled for construction in 2024) and end at the existing asphalt/concrete pavement transition south of the SW 15th Street intersection. See image below for a map of the general project location.

The existing pavement condition on SW Topeka Boulevard from SW 21st Street to SW 15th Street consists of significant surface distresses and pavement failures that will require complete reconstruction of the roadway. City utilities, curb and gutter, sidewalks, sidewalk ramps, and other roadway features are to be evaluated for replacement with this project. The existing traffic signals at the SW 17th Street and SW Topeka Boulevard intersection were replaced a few years ago and are not included in this project. Bid alternates for both asphalt and concrete pavement are to be included with this project.

The proposed project schedule includes survey and design beginning in 2023; utility relocation and rightof-way acquisition, if necessary, to occur in 2024; and construction to occur in 2025 and 2026. Construction is anticipated to be phased over two construction seasons in order to carry traffic and provide access during construction.

III. Scope of Services

This project will produce a set of drawings and project manual for a roadway reconstruction project. The project will be designed and constructed in accordance with the City of Topeka and Shawnee County Standard Technical Specifications. Basic Services provided may include, but are not limited to the following:

- a. Meet with City staff at critical stages throughout design.
- b. Perform field and topographic surveys.
- c. Perform CCTV inspections of all enclosed storm sewers with the project limits.
- d. Perform investigative soil borings.
- e. Coordinate with other City utilities and private utility owners.

- o. Prepare addenda as necessary.
- p. Prepare a tabulation of bids and make a recommendation of award for construction.

IV. Deliverables

Final project drawings, project manual with technical specifications, and cost estimates will be completed in conjunction with the proposed schedule indicated above. The Design Firm chosen for performing the design services will also provide Project Management services for this project.

V. City Resources to Be Provided

All information that the City has relating to the project will be made available to the selected firm.

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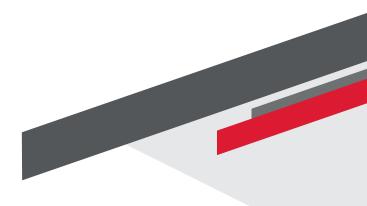

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

The City of Topeka issued the RFP to provide engineering services and construction documents for the reconstruction of Topeka Boulevard from 21st Street to 15th Street. Topeka Boulevard is a very heavily traveled arterial and leaves a lasting impression on residents and visitors of Topeka. The best street in Topeka should be the one named after it and the push to "Bring Back the Boulevard" has the goal to improve the overall look and performance of the corridor to help with the economic growth of the surrounding areas.



Boulevard Familiarity

Professional Engineering Consultants called the 1200 block of Topeka Boulevard its home for 12 years before outgrowing the office and needing to relocate to our current location. Many current PEC employees remember how much the Boulevard deteriorated over our time there and are ecstatic to see this project come to fruition.

PEC is currently designing the reconstruction of the intersection of 21st and Topeka Boulevard as well as the stretch of Topeka Boulevard from 29th to 21st. We hope to seamlessly work the design of this section of Topeka Boulevard from 21st to 15th into the other projects. This will relieve headaches for the City by having to coordinate with multiple contacts and firms that would collaborate on the design. Minor differences in design elements can cause major problems during construction. With these projects we have collected full topographic survey at the intersection of 21st and Topeka and drone flown aerial imagery and LiDAR from 29th Street past 15th Street in preparation for this future project to come out and to save money for the city on project costs. PEC also provides engineering design services to Kwik Shop and designed the location at the corner of 17th and Topeka in 2016.

Meeting City Expectations

An interactive approach is to be used in order to ensure the planning and design services provided by PEC all meet City expectations. Working with City staff, City council, and the general public throughout the project will lead to a consensus of all involved. Jason Fundis, PE will be the Project Manager and Alex Darby, PE will lead any needed utility coordination. Jason and Alex both have numerous projects completed with the City previously, and both are familiar with expectations and staff. Ben Mabry PE will be the Principal-in-Charge for the project. Ben is very familiar with the City's expectations, as he has worked for years on City projects. Tim Aziere PE, PTOE will provide quality control for the project. Additional staff and their roles are included in project organizational chart.



PROJECT APPROACH

Maximizing Improvement, Limiting Cost

PEC knows how important it is to Topeka to improve the existing roads to support the growth of the City. Prioritizing the most critical improvements will be the first step for this stretch of Topeka Boulevard. Since the project will be replacing the pavement, the existing city utilities should be evaluated to minimize future replacements within road. A majority of the curb is still in good or great condition, so that will be helpful to the overall cost savings of the project to minimize those replacement. PEC's current approach for Topeka Boulevard from 29th to 21st is design from aerial and LiDAR with field topography to be picked up as needed. This approach could work the same for this portion of Topeka Boulevard to further minimize the cost to the city without effecting the quality of work.

To the project specific, we plan to replace curb and gutter where there is extensive damage to the existing curb. Currently, we have only identified 2 locations where this would be needed, those locations being on the east side of the road north of the bridge in front of Speedy Brakes and on the east side of the road north of 21st in front of DriveTime. Sidewalk will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis for replacements and the sidewalk ramps will be replaced where needed to meet ADA compliance and City of Topeka standards. We have counted 68 sidewalk ramps that will need to be evaluated for ADA compliance. Another important factor with this project will be increasing the longevity of the pavement. PEC's Vice President of Geotechnical Engineering, Bob Henthorne, works in our Topeka office and is well versed in selecting proper pavement sections and assessing the best course of action to keep the Boulevard pristine. Options for the roadway can include full depth concrete, full depth asphalt, or concrete base with an asphalt surfacing composite. It will be imperative to future proof the Boulevard to allow ease to maintain and keep the Boulevard looking good while also balancing the long-term integrity of the pavement. Overall, PEC will balance the funding and improvements for the traveling public. It is important to find these cost-saving measures along this project while also delivering the highest quality of product to Topekans.



Making the Boulevard Drain

With the full reconstruction of the pavement, it would be an opportune time to evaluate other improvements to the corridor – particularly the storm sewer. This would include evaluating the surface and subsurface components of drainage. PEC would ensure that the existing storm network is adequately sized to handle large rainfall events. We do this using the Topeka modified rational method that we input into Civil 3D's storm sewer model and is evaluated using the Analyze Gravity Network (AGN) tool. This allows us to make real time edits to the storm sewer and see the effects instantly in our plans. We can then evaluate hydraulic grade lines to show the impacts without having to export a static model and then reiterate this process until something works. This makes storm sewer design much easier to present and solve pipe routing or capacity issues quickly. Increasing the subsurface drainage with underdrains at sump inlets and on-grade inlets under 0.6% longitudinal slope would drastically improve the pavement longevity. We will evaluate the surface drainage of the entire road to ensure nothing gets overlooked and any existing drainage issues are mitigated.

Getting the Public Involved

PEC understands the importance of listening to the community, the residents and businesses that will be most heavily impacted by this project. The Boulevard is always a hot item when road quality is discussed with Topekans. To ensure we produce the best possible product for the everyday users of this corridor it will be important to listen to improvements they would like to see and the benefits that can be accomplished. We will provide a design that meets the goals and objectives of all the stakeholders to Topeka Boulevard. Engaging the community with public information meetings early and often in the design process to get input on what requirements the people who utilize the roadway want and make accommodations to satisfy public requests in cooperation with City staff needs. Providing project consensus is critical to successful implementation for current and future projects. A method we have found beneficial to public engagement is utilizing a project website that will be tied to the City's current website and will be used during design and throughout construction to communicate construction phasing, detours, and scheduling. PEC provided ArcGIS StoryMap for the East Side Interceptor Rehabilitation project that was recently finished for the City of Topeka. This story map included the aspects that get the public to buy-in and understand the nuances of the project.

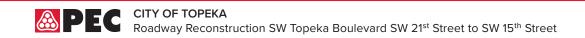

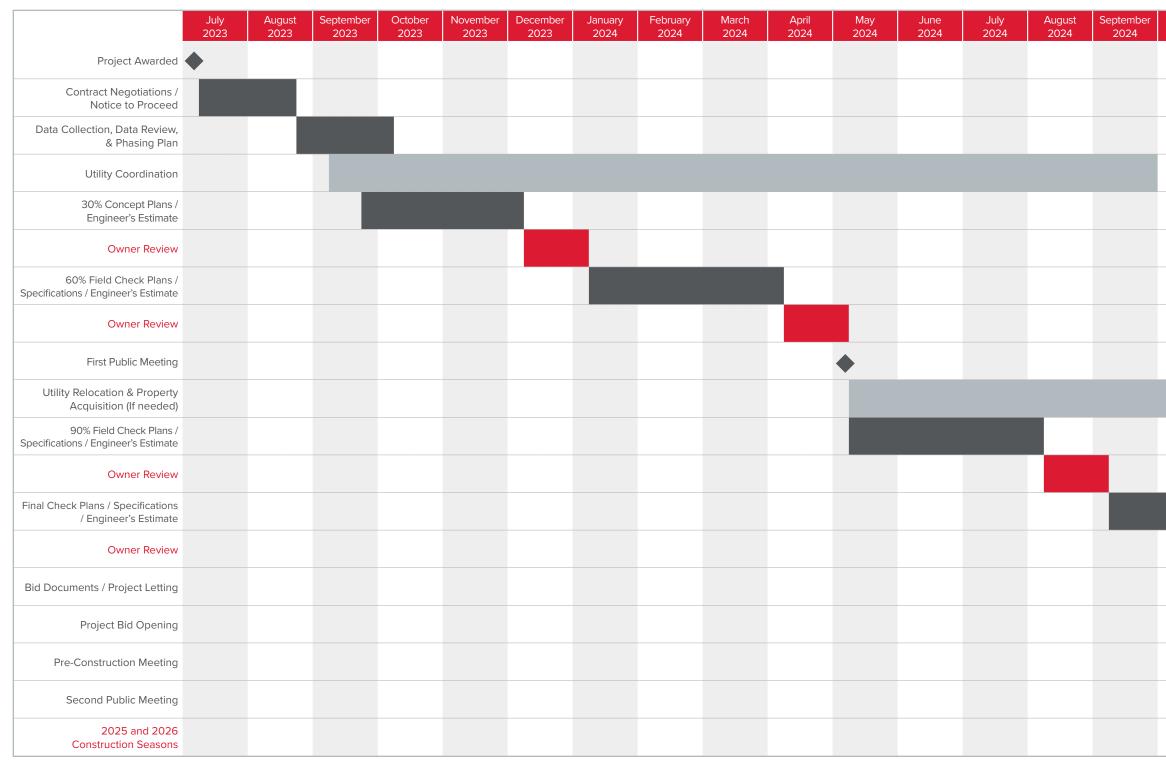

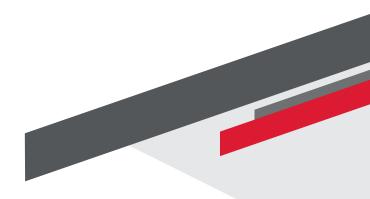

SW 10TH STREET IMPROVEMENTS WANAMAKER TO FAIRLAWN

TOPEKA, KS

This mile-long project continued the conversion of a 2-lane rural section with ditches to a 3-lane curb and gutter urban arterial. This route provides access to multiple living facilities and residential properties. New pedestrian and bicyclist amenities are provided with a 5-foot wide sidewalk on the south side of 10th Street and a 10-foot wide shared use path on the north. Additional complete streets components include provisions for transit stops, pedestrian crosswalks, and energy-efficient LED street lighting. To allow access to all properties, a two-year construction sequencing program was implemented to allow access to all properties.

SW 17TH STREET IMPROVEMENTS

I-470 TO SW MACVICAR TOPEKA, KS

This 2.75-mile-long project is to repair and replace the outdated 3-lane collector with a new 3-lane roadway. The project will modernize the streets and intersections by using current design criteria, including a new roundabout at 17th and Oakley. A 10foot wide shared-use path will stretch along the north side of the roadway, paired with a new 5-foot wide sidewalk on the south. This route provides access to a variety of property types including restaurants, churches, elementary schools, law firms, apartment units, shopping centers, cemetery, banks, and several residential properties. Additional complete streets components in this project include on-street parking in the business district, high quality streetscaping and landscaping, provisions for transit stops, pedestrian crosswalks at key locations along the corridor, and energy-efficient LED street lighting. The project is currently in the design phase and is on schedule for construction to begin in 2023.

TOPEKA, KANSAS | PROJECTS

10th STREET IMPROVEMENTS | FAIRLAWN ROAD TO GAGE BOULEVARD

This mile-long project converted a 2-lane rural section without shoulders to a 3-lane urban arterial. The route provides access to Gage Park, a neighborhood commercial center, multiple senior living facilities, and residential properties. New pedestrian and bicyclist connectivity is provided with a 5-foot sidewalk on the south and a 10-foot shared-use path on the north, adjacent to the park.

SW CLAY STREET | 6th STREET TO 10th STREET

The project replaced the deteriorating street, provided new curb and gutter, replaced the water main, and repaired broken sidewalks and ramps to bring the area into compliance with ADA regulations. In addition, PEC provided utility coordination, geotechnical investigation, and construction inspection. This project won the APWA 2018 Kansas Project of the Year in Historic Preservation (under \$5M) category.

SW BELLE AVENUE | 17th STREET TO 21st STREET

This project included pavement assessment and design of a 2-lane asphalt roadway with curb and gutter, concrete pavement at intersections, traffic signal loop replacement, and pavement markings. Construction phasing was unique because it included more than forty driveways in a half-mile stretch. Coordination with Topeka West High School was also required in order to safely provide access to student drivers during construction.

29TH & BURLINGAME | INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS

ADA accessibility was the primary focus for this project. In addition to accessible push-button ramps, crosswalks, and more, the project included more than 6,100 square yards of full depth concrete pavement reconstruction and traffic signal replacement. Two legs also received mill and overlaying past the full depth section of the roadway.

SE 45th STREET IMPROVEMENTS | SE TOPEKA BOULEVARD TO SE CALIFORNIA AVENUE

This project reconstructed two miles of an existing 2-lane suburban arterial roadway into a 5-lane roadway with curb, gutter, storm sewer, and detention ponds. The intersection at SE 45th Street and California Avenue is a dual-lane roundabout that provides for a future intersection volume of 32,000 vehicles per day.

SW 10th STREET PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE | OVER WANAMAKER STORMWATER BASIN

PEC designed a new, 120-foot long prefabricated structural pedestrian bridge with a 10-foot wide shared-use path on the north side of SW 10th Street. PEC assisted the City of Topeka with applying for a grant for additional funding for the shared-use path and pedestrian bridge between Wanamaker Road and Robinson Avenue.

UNIVERSITY OF KANSAS I CENTRAL DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT

This project involved a design-build, Public-Private Partnership redevelopment of a portion of the campus. 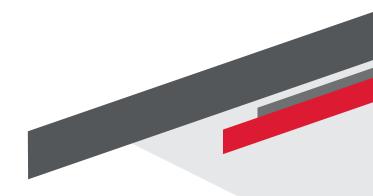

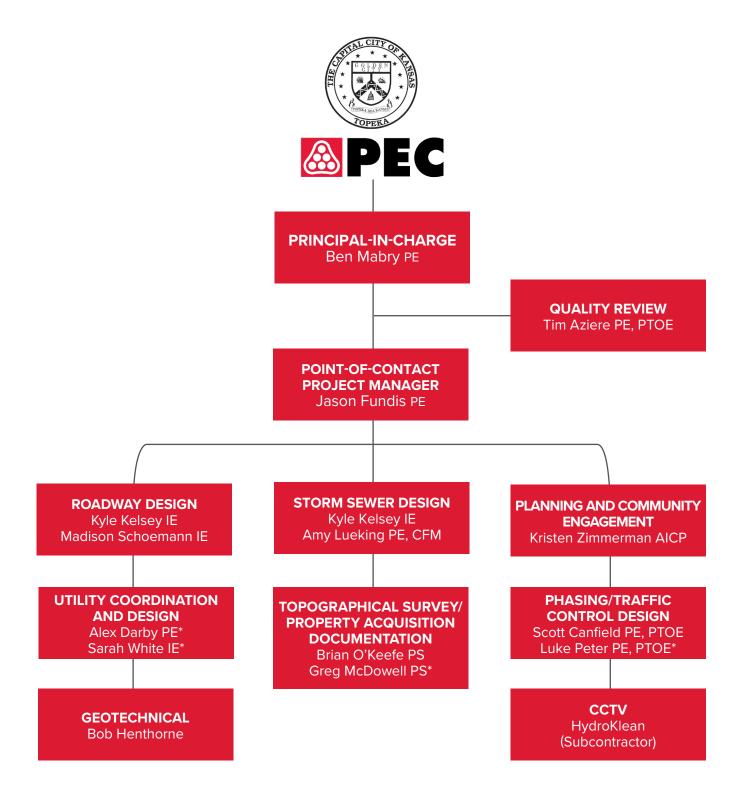

BACKGROUND:

<u>Procedures for Addressing the Governing Body</u> In accordance with Governing Body Rules, the following protocols for public comment apply:

- Each person shall state his or her name and city of residence in an audible tone for the record.
- All remarks shall be addressed to the Governing Body as a whole -- not to any individual member.
- In order to provide additional time for as many individuals as possible to address the Governing Body, each individual signed up to speak will need to complete his or her comments within four minutes.

The following behavior will not be tolerated from any speaker:

- Uttering fighting words
- Slander
- Speeches invasive of the privacy of individuals (no mention of names) Unreasonably Loud Speech
- Repetitious Speech or Debate
- Speeches so disruptive of proceedings that the legislative process is substantially interrupted

Any speaker who engages in this type of behavior will be warned once by the presiding office (Mayor). If the

behavior continues, the speaker will be ordered to cease his or her behavior. If the speaker persists in interfering with the ability of the Governing Body to carry out its function, he or she will be removed from the City Council Chambers or Zoom meeting room.

Members of the public, Governing Body and staff are expected to treat one another with respect at all times.

Zoom Meeting Protocol

- Make sure your Zoom name, email and/or phone number matches what was submitted to the City Clerk when you signed up for public comment. Any misnamed or unauthorized users will not be admitted to Zoom.
- Please keep your mic muted and your camera off until you are called by the Mayor to give your comment.
- If you are cut off during your comment time due to an internet connection or technical issue, you will need to submit your comments in writing to the City Clerk atcclerk@topeka.orgor 215 SE 7thStreet, Room 166, Topeka, KS 66603 for attachment to the minutes.
- If you break any of the public comment rules, you will receive one warning from the Mayor. If you continue any prohibited behavior, you will be removed from the Zoom meeting room and will not be allowed to rejoin.
- Public comment is limited to four minutes. You may receive an extension at the discretion of the Governing Body. The timer will be visible to you in the 'City of Topeka Admin' window on the Zoom app. Call-in users will hear one beep when a minute is remaining and then another beep when time has expired.
- Please do not share the Zoom login information with anyone. Any unauthorized users will not be admitted to the Zoom meeting room.
